

Many of the preceptors at PCSP go above and beyond what is required of them and we want to recognize their efforts. The Office of Experiential Education and Experiential Program Review Committee (EPRC) have created a credentialing process to increase the recognition of our exceptional preceptors. To become eligible for the Master Preceptor level, the preceptor should submit all materials and CV to the OEE by **November 1** each year. Master Preceptors are recommended for adjunct faculty status in January and recognized at the White Coat Ceremony in August.

- Meets all preceptor requirements *PLUS*
- Active preceptor for PCSP for 5 years
- Precept minimum of 20 students over previous 5 years (set based on average)
- Attend one preceptor workshop once every 5 years
- Student evaluation average consistently above 4.5
